## Dr. John Amatruda

Most recently Dr. Amatruda was Senior Vice President and Franchise Head for Diabetes and Obesity and a member of the Research Management Committee at Merck. Dr Amatruda graduated from Yale University, received his MD degree from the Medical College of Wisconsin and did his internship and residency in Internal Medicine and Fellowship in Endocrinology and Metabolism at The Johns Hopkins Hospital. He is board certified in internal medicine and Endocrinology and Metabolism. Dr. Amatruda was a Professor of Medicine at The University of Rochester School of Medicine where he was head of the Clinical Research Center, fully funded as principle investigator on two NIH grants and acting Head of the Endocrine Metabolism Unit. He assisted in the approval of Acarbose and his group put several compounds into clinical development including the first glucagon receptor antagonist. Most recently Dr. Amatruda was Senior Vice President and Franchise Head for Diabetes and Obesity and a member of the Research Management Committee. Dr. Amatruda's group filed VItorin, Januvia and Janumet. Dr. Amatruda is an author on 150 papers, abstracts, reviews and book chapters. Dr. Amatruda continues to see patients.
